A group of eight from Upper Bann attended the U3A climate Change conference in Monaghan, where we heard some memorable contributions from Fr Sean McDonagh, Eco Theologian, Dr Paul Nolan, Meterologist with ICHEC, Dr Frank McGovern, Head of Climate Change Research and Science EPA, Professor John Barry, School of Politics and International Studies QUB and Dr Lorna Gold, Head of Policy and Advocacy.

In the afternoon we worked alongside some young

people from Friends of the Earth and local schools. There were also minor inputs from representative of Grandparents for a Safe Earth, Age Action Ireland, Linking Generations NI, Young Trocaire Activists, and TY students. We could not fail to be aware of the precarious state of the planet and our role in it. Feelings of anger, guilt and panic predominated. Ulster's Forgotten Hero was the title of the talk at October's monthly Get-Together given by David Armstrong, former editor of the Portadown Times, He delivered an interesting and passionate talk on John King (1838 – 1872). King was an Irish soldier from Moy Co Tyrone, who achieved fame as an Australian explorer. He was the sole survivor of the four men from the ill-fated Burke and Wills expedition who reached the Gulf of Carpentaria. The expedition was the first to cross Australia from south to north, finding a route across the continent from Melbourne in Victoria to the Gulf of Carpentaria in Queensland. The full story is well worth reading.


