Once a year they venture to more distant parts and this was their second trip to Westport. Despite gloomy weather forecasts, it was an unqualified success even though there might have been copious amounts of baby cream on the tender parts (particularly my bottom) - and eyes strained after map-reading skills were put to the test.

'we're nearly there' it was a relieved party that rode into the remote village of Aghagower where the local shop serves as a grocery store/pub and where hastily made sandwiches, tea and coffee were scoffed. And Maureen managed to catch her breath after non-stop chirping on the 66-mile two-day trip!

Tom, reassured that 'everyone is happy' (like hell they were as they reached the hilltops!), led the group back to the hotel with the praise (well most of it praise) of everyone ringing in his ears - his dedication to the U3A and to the Easy Riders has given a lot of people, myself included, a new purpose in life and while my walking and golf the next day were somewhat shaky it was certainly an exhilarating and memorable four-day trip to the wild but scenic west coast.

Thank you Tom and a big thank-you to Valerie for sharing with us some of the frustrations of living with a husband who doesn't know the meaning of taking it easy he walks, cycles, leads the U3A Bridge class and plays Bridge three or four nights a week. And, he tells me, he might take up mapreading!!!


Mary has been a member of many volunteering groups for the past two decades, including organisations such as The Samaritans and Cruse Bereavement Care.
